The committee, therefore, beg leave to recommend the following proceedings:

Ordered, That the treasurers of this state furnish a copy of this report to the several officers concerned therein, and to cause to be put in suit, according to the provision of the act of December session 1829, chapter 90, any pecuniary right or credit of the state which the debtor shall have withheld three months or more, and particularly with reference to any penalty incurred from a disregard of the resolution of December session of 1827, chapter 70.
