Mr. Rogerson from the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, made a favourable report upon the order of the house instructing them to inquire into the propriety of allowing to Jannett Lingan, the widow of Gen. James M. Lingan, deceased, a pension; accompanied with the following resolution.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore, pay to Jannett Lingan, of Montgomery county, or to her order, during her widowhood, in quarter yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a Captain, as a further remuneration for her late husband's services during the revolutionary war.

Which was read.

SATURDAY, February 19, 1831.
