

On motion by Mr. McMahon, the house resolved to proceed with the ordinary business of the session during the absence of the door-keeper.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of John Contee Keith; also the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate certain persons therein mentioned for the purpose of establishing a school called The Liberty Grove School, in Cecil county; also the bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to the appointment of constables in this state, and for other purposes, passed at December session 1824, chapter 140, severally endorsed "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed.

Also the bill, entitled, An act to divorce Henry Davis and Caroline M. Davis, of the city of Baltimore, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read the first and second time by special order, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Also the bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act of December session 1827, chapter 117, entitled, An act to regulate the issuing of licenses to traders, keepers of ordinaries, and others; also the bill, entitled, An act to repeal a part of an act passed at December session 1829, chapter 106, and for other purposes; also the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of John Barks of Washington county, and Mary Barks of Frederick county; also the bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the recovery of small debts out of court, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned, severally endorsed "will not pass."
