

Also, reports from the Sheriffs of Caroline and Kent counties, relative to the several sums of money paid into the public Treasury, within the year ending on the 30th of November, 1831—which were read and severally referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Also, reports from the clerks of Washington, Hartford, Charles, Frederick, Anne Arundel, Caroline, Worcester, and Dorchester counties, relative to the attendance of Judges; which were read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Also, reports from the Trustees of Charlotte Hall School, and Rockville Academy; which were read, and referred to the committee on Education.

Also, a report from the Clerk of the House of Delegates, in obedience to the sixth rule of the House, accompanied with a list of the bills, resolutions, and reports, which originated in the House, and were referred from the preceding to the succeeding session; which was read.

Mr. Ely reported a bill, entitled An act to confirm the proceedings of certain commissioners, and extend the time for making a road in Baltimore county; which was read.

Messrs. Hood and Johnson, the committee appointed to wait on his Excellency the Governor, and inform him that a quorum of the House having convened, were ready to proceed to business and receive any communication he might be pleased to lay before them, reported, that the committee had performed the duties of their appointment, and that the Governor had answered, that he would transmit a communication to this House, to-day at one o'clock.

Mr. Thomas, of Queen Anne's, obtained leave to bring in a bill; to be entitled, An additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act authorising gates to be kept on the public roads in Queen Anne's county, passed December session, 1823, chapter 107; ordered, that Messrs. Thomas, of Queen Anne's, Roberts and Harcastle, report the same.

Mr. Sutton obtained leave to bring in a bill, to authorise the clerk of Harford county, to record certain deeds therein mentioned; ordered, that Messrs. Sutton, Amos and Johns, report the same.

Mr. Laurensen obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled An act to incorporate the Visitors of the Jail of Baltimore city and county; ordered, that Messrs. Laurensen, Hunt and Moores, report the same.

Mr. Brookhart obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, An act to abolish all such parts of the constitution and form of government of this state, as relates to the pre-
