Mr. Lake presented the memorial and petition of sundry citizens of Dorchester county, praying for the establishment of a financial institution, to be founded upon the invested moneys in the treasury, for the supply of revenue to the state, and to the general accommodation and benefit of the people; which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Hollman presented the petition of sundry citizens of Washington county, praying for the establishment of a Bank in Williamsport, to be called, The Washington County Bank; which was read and referred to Messrs. Hollman, Brookhart, Fitzhugh, Lyles and Hunt.

Mr. Johns presented the petition of John Norris and Caleb Pue, praying for a law to authorise the commissioners of Harford county, to grant them a jury to value the damages sustained by a public road, laid out through their premises; which was read and referred to Messrs. Johns, Sutton and Amos.

Mr. Brewer presented the memorial of the committee on the part of the corporation of Annapolis, praying to be exempted from county taxes, and for an amendment of their charter; which was read, and referred to Messrs. Brewer, Williamson and Stewart.
