Mr. Thomas, of Queen Anne's, reported a bill, entitled, An act for the revaluation of the real and personal property in Queen Anne's county; which was read.

The bill reported by Mr. M'Kinstrey, entitled, An act to authorise John Kinzer, Henry Herring and Solomon Sailor, trustees named in a certain deed, from John Wampler, or heir successors, to build a suitable house on the lot therein conveyed, for the residence and accommodation of a teacher;

And the bill reported by Mr. Johns, entitled, An act for the relief of John Norris and Caleb Pue, of Harford county;

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time, passed, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Swan, from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill from the Senate, entitled, An act for the benefit of Reuben Worthington, of Allegany county.

The said bill was then read the first, and by special order the second time, and passed.

Mr. M'Kinstrey, reported a bill, entitled, An act to revive and continue in force, an act, entitled, An act to preserve the side walks in Union town, Frederick county, passed December session, 1850, chapter 2.

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Roberts, entitled, An act authorising William Beck to act as Guardian to his two minor children in Queen Anne's county, was taken up for consideration, read the second time, and rejected.

The bill reported by Mr. Sutton, entitled, An act to authorise the clerk of Harford county court, to record the deeds therein mentioned, was taken up for consideration.

When on motion by Mr. Johns, said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the Senate returned the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Joseph Wood, former Sheriff of Calvert county. And the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of William B. Burk, of the city of Baltimore, severally endorsed, Will pass; ordered to be engrossed.—And delivered a bill, originated in and passed by the Senate, entitled, An act extending the time for taking the bond of the Sheriff of Somerset county; which was read and referred to Messrs. Teackle, Cottman, and Bell.
