Mr. Hollman presented the petition of sundry citizens of Washington county, praying the passage of An act authorising the commissioners of said county, to levy a sum of money sufficient to build a stone bridge over the Antietam creek, at or near Booths Mill; which was read and referred to Messrs. Hollman, Hall, and Fitzhugh.

Mr. Stansbury presented the petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore county, praying the passage of a law, authorising the Commissioners of Baltimore county, to repair a bridge over the Great Gunpowder falls, kown by the name of Cromwell's bridge, which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

And, Mr. Edelen presented the memorial of the Trustees of Charlotte Hall school, praying the revival of a Lottery grant for the benefit of said school, which was read and referred to the committee on Lotteries.

The Speaker laid before the house, reports from the clerks of the Court of Appeals for the Western and Eastern Shores; also, a report from the clerk of Calvert county court, relative to the attendance of Judges; which were read and severally referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.—Also, a report of the Register of the Land Office of the Eastern Shore, relative to the several sums of money appearing by the papers on file, or of record in his office, to have been paid into the Eastern Shore treasury, within the year ending on the 30th of November, 1831; which was read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means. And, a report of the Trustees of Allegany county Academy; which was read and referred to the committee on education.
