Mr. Hunt made a favorable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled, An act supplementary to the act, entitled, An act for the dispatch of business in Baltimore county court.

The said bill was then read the first and by special order

the second time, and passed.

On motion by Mr. Sutton, the house took up for consideration, the bill reported by him, entitled, An act to authorise the clerk of Harford county court to record the deeds therein mentioned.

The said bill was then read the second time, and passed. The bill reported by Mr. Stansbury, entitled, An act to encourage the destruction of crows in Baltimore county, was taken up for consideration.

When on motion by Mr. Turner, of Baltimore, said bill

was ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the senate, returned the bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the benefit of Asahel Hussey, and others, endorsed, "Will pass;" ordered to be engrossed.

The speaker laid before the house, a report of the treasurer of the Western Shore in obedience to an order of the House of Delegates, of the 3d January 1832, relative

to the tobacco inspection revenue; which was read.

Mr. Dalrymple moved to refer the report to a select

committee.—Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Teackle, the report was then referred to the committee on ways and means, and ordered to be printed.

Mr. Teackle submitted the following preamble and resolutions:—

Whereas, the establishment of Light Houses at Hooper's or Barren Island, in Dorchester county, and at Sharp's Island, in Talbot county, have long been objects of desire to all concerned in the trade and navigation of the Chesapeake Bay; and whereas, it is believed, that the loss of a large amount of property might have been avoided, and many valuable lives saved to the country by the timely erection of the lights desired on those islands; and whereas, the necessary enactments for the cession of territorial jurisdiction, and the condemnation of sites have been passed by this legislature. Therefore,

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the senators and representatives of this state, in the congress of the United States, be requested to use their exertions to procure appropriations for the erection of Light
