

Also, the petition of Joshua Tibbitts and others, of the city of Baltimore, praying the passage of An act to make valid the last will and testament of William Walter Dallas, deceased; which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Wilson, of Cecil, presented the petition of sundry citizens of Cecil county, praying the passage of An act, authorising the commissioners of said county, to levy a sum of money for the support of Nelly Moore, a poor woman of said county; which was read and referred to the committee on pensions to indigent persons, by county assessment.

Mr. Richardson presented the petition of the President and Directors of the Frederick County Bank, praying an alteration of their charter, for the better accommodation of drawers, non residents of Fredericktown, &c.—which was read and referred to Messrs. Richardson, Johnson and Jones.

Mr. Launson presented the memorial of Hannah Levering, of the city of Baltimore, praying compensation for a house used as an Armory for the 51st Regiment Maryland Militia; which was read and referred to the committee on claims.

Mr. Turner, of Baltimore, presented the petition of Francis Williams and Robert Williams, praying for An act authorising the clerk of Anne Arundel county court, to record two deeds therein mentioned; which was read and referred to Messrs. Turner, of Baltimore, Hood and Kent.

And, Mr. Jones, of Caroline, presented the petition of Joseph Richardson, clerk of Caroline county court, relative to monies paid into the Eastern Shore Treasury, under an act of Assembly, passed at December session, 1823; chapter 146, entitled, An act to tax certain offices; which was read and referred to the committee on claims.

The speaker laid before the house, a report from the late sheriff of Talbot county, relative to the several sums of money paid by him into the Eastern Shore Treasury, within the year ending on the 30th of November, 1831; which was read and referred to the committee on ways and means.
