When on motion by Mr. Handy, said bill was laid on the table, and made the order of the day for Monday next, the 16th inst.

The bill reported by Mr. Johns, entitled, An act to repeal an act, entitled, An act to abolish imprisonment for debt on certain judgments rendered by justices of the peace, passed at December session, 1830; chapter 155, was taken up for consideration.

When on motion by Mr. Sutton, said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the senate return the bill, entitled, An act to confirm the proceedings of certain commissioners, and extend the time for making a road in Baltimore county, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments," which amendments were severally read the first and second time by special order, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed;

And, delivered a bill originated in and passed by the senate, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company for erecting a bridge over Choptank River, at or near Dover Ferry; which was read and referred to Messrs. Dudley, Hardcastle, and Bruff.

Mr. Johnson obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, An act to regulate the election of clerk of the county court, and register of wills for Frederick county; ordered, that Messrs. Johnson, Richardson, and Jones, report the same.

The House then adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock
