The bill reported by Mr. Moores, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for electing commissioners for Harford county, and prescribing their powers and duties, passed at December session, 1827; was taken up for consideration, read the second time, and on the question being put—Shall the bill pass? it was resolved in the affirmative.

ny, was taken up for consideration;
