

Mr. Jones of Frederick, presented the petition of sundry citizens of Montgomery and Frederick counties, praying an act authorising the opening of a road from Barnsville in Montgomery county, to intersect the public road on the North side of Bennet's Creek, at or near Tanneyhills Grist Mill, in Frederick county; which were read, and severally referred to the committee on Internal Improvements.

Mr. Swan presented the petition of sundry citizens of Allegany county, praying the establishment of a Bank in the town of Williamsport, Washington county, to be called The Washington County Bank; which was read, and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Hunt presented the petition of Jonathan Kershner, of Hagerstown, and James P. Bayless, of the city of Baltimore, praying that the Treasurer of the Western Shore, may be authorised to refund them part of the amount of a bail bond; which was read, and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice;

And, Mr. McKinstrey presented the petition of sundry citizens of Frederick county, praying for the repeal of the third section of An act, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, passed December session, 1830, chapter 130; which was read, and referred to Messrs. McKinstrey, Johnson, Pearce, Hunt, and Hood.

Mr. Teackle obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, An act to make valid and confirm the proceedings of Job Allen, as a justice of the peace, for Somerset county; ordered, that Messrs. Teackle, Cottman, and Bell, report the same.

Mr. Stansbury obtained leave to bring in a bill, supplementary to an act, entitled, An act to lay out and open a road from Hames old field, in Baltimore county, to Lisbon, in Anne Arundel county, passed December session, 1829, chapter 155; ordered, that Messrs. Stansbury, Ely, and Holmes, report the same.

Mr. Dalrymple obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to extend the time for taking the bond of the Sheriff of Calvert county; ordered, that Messrs. Dalrymple, Smith, and Parran, report the same.

Mr. Rogerson, chairman of the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, made favourable reports on the petitions of Rebecca Sewell, widow of William Sewell, and Margaret King, widow of Levin King, Revolutionary soldiers, accompanied with the following resolutions.
