Mr. Rogerson, chairman of the committee on Pensions and Revolutionary claims; made favourable reports on the petitions of Richard Hall, of Anne Arundel county, and Leah Winbrough widow of Thomas P. Winbrough, Revolutionary soldiers, accompanied with the following resolutions.

*Resolved*, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Richard Hall, of Anne Arundel county, a soldier of the Revolutionary war, or to his order during life, in half yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a further remuneration for his services during said war.
