Ordered, That the committee on claims, inquire into the justice of the claim preferred by Charles E. Tilden, of Kent county, and report thereon.

Mr. Rogerson, chairman of the committee on Pensions and Revolutionary claims, made a favourable report on the petition of Reuben Ross, of the state of Ohio, a Revolutionary soldier, praying for a pension, accompanied with the following resolution.

Resolved, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Ruben Ross, of Clermont county, state of Ohio, a soldier of the Revolutionary war, or to his order during life half in yearly payments a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a further remuneration for his services during the revolutionary war.
