

A deputation from the Senate being announced, Messrs. Emory and Taney, members of that body, appeared within the bar, and acquainted the Speaker and the House of Delegates that, in accordance with the joint invitations of both Houses, which had been personally communicated to him, the Governor elect was then attending in the Senate Chamber, where the Senate requested the attendance of the Speaker, with that of the other members of this House, to witness the qualification of the Governor elect.

The Speaker thereupon left the chair, and attended by the members of this House, went to the Senate Chamber, where the Honorable George Howard was duly qualified as Governor of the State of Maryland, in the presence of both Houses, in the manner and form prescribed by the Constitution and laws thereof. The Speaker, attended by the members of the House, returned and resumed the chair.

The House adjourned until to morrow-morning at ten o'clock.

TUESDAY, January 17th, 1832.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled An act to establish a Bank, and incorporate a company under the name of the Frederick County Bank;

Mr. Purnell presented the petition of sundry citizens of Worcester county, praying for the establishment of a State Bank; which was read, and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Thomas, of Cecil, presented the petition of sundry citizens of Cecil county, praying the passage of an act, authorising the commissioners of said county, to levy a sum of money to rebuild a bridge over Conowingo Creek; which was read, and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Edelen presented the petition of Mary Ann Mudd, Jane Hammersley and others, praying for an act to incorporate the Carmelite Sisters of Baltimore; which was read, and referred to Messrs. Edelen, Launson, and Hunt.
