

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time, the reports concurred in, and the resolutions therein contained, severally assented to.

The bill reported by Mr. Moores, entitled, An act to abolish all such parts of the constitution and form of government, as relate to the time and manner of electing the senate and the mode of filling up vacancies in that body, so that each county and the city of Baltimore, may have a Senator to be elected immediately by the people, was taken up for consideration;

When on motion by Mr. Edelen, said bill was laid on the table; and made the order of the day for Thursday the 19th inst.

The hour having arrived for taking up the orders of the day, the house proceeded to consider the first order of the day, it being the bill reported by Mr. Handy, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the speedy recovery of small debts out of court, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned.

Mr. Ely moved to strike out the second section of the bill,

Determined in the negative;

The said bill was then read the second time and passed.

The house then proceeded to consider the second order of the day, being the preamble and resolutions from the senate, relative to re-chartering the United States Bank;

Mr Ely moved to lay them on the table,

Determined in the negative;

Mr. Teackle moved to amend the second resolution, by adding at the end thereof the following, 'for twenty years from the termination of its present charter;

*Provided*, That the existing capital of the institution be augmented by fifteen millions of dollars, for the benefit of the people of the United States, to be apportioned among the states, for the supply of means for education in common schools, according to their respective representations in the popular branch of the national legislature;"

Determined in the negative;
