

On the question being put, will the house adopt the substitute, it was determined in the negative.

Mr. Moores then offered as a substitute for said report the following resolution.

*Resolved*, That the petition of Joshua Guyton, Sheriff of Harford county, and the several vouchers, accompanying the same, be, and they are hereby referred to his Excellency, the Governor, and the honorable the Council. And they are hereby authorised to allow to said Guyton such compensation as they may deem reasonable for money paid and expended by him for apprehending negro Nace, and they are authorised to draw upon the treasurer of the Western Shore in favour of said Guyton an order for such sum as they may allow him.

On the question being put, on the adoption of the substitute, it was determined in the negative.

The question was then put, will the house concur in the report; resolved in the affirmative.

The House adjourned until to morrow-morning ten o'clock.

FRIDAY, January 20th, 1832.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Also, the bill, entitled, An act to repeal the third section of an act, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, passed at December session, 1830.
