Also, the bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the widening of certain streets near Washington Monument, in the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes therein mentioned;

Also, the bill, entitled, An act to blend New Town, (Trap,) and New Freedom, in Frederick county, into one, by the name of Jefferson; and to establish boundaries of lots by commissioners, and to incorporate the same;

And, the resolution authorising the State Librarian to dispose of the surplus books in the Library, were sent to the Senate.

Mr. Hunt presented the petition of Isaac P. Cook, and others, of the city of Baltimore, praying the passage of an act to incorporate the Maryland Beneficial Society; which was read and referred to Messrs. Hunt, Laurenson and Turner, of Baltimore.

Mr. Moores presented the petition of sundry citizens of Harford county, praying that Scott Praston may be placed on the pension list of said county.

Mr. Turner, of Charles, presented the petition of Jane Louisa Parker, of Charles county, praying to be placed on the pension list of said county,

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on pensions to indigent persons by county assessment.

Mr. Dalrymple presented the memorial of James B. Dixon, clerk to the commissioners of Calvert county, praying that said commissioners may be authorised to levy a further sum of money, as an additional compensation for his services; which was read and referred to Messrs. Dalrymple, Smith and Parran.

Mr. Laurenson presented the memorial of John C. Ely, and others, of the city of Baltimore, praying for an act to incorporate a company to make a floating saw mill; which was read and referred to the committee on manufactures.

Mr. Johnson presented the petition of sundry citizens of the third election district of Frederick county, praying that the said district may be divided; which was read and referred to Messrs. Johnson, M'Kinstry and Richardson.

Mr. Pearce presented the petition of Frederick Wilson, register of wills for Kent county, praying the passage of an act to authorise the transcription of certain records; which was read and referred to Messrs. Pearce, Brown, of Kent and Welch;
