And the bill reported by Mr. Brawner, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to abolish the office of commissioners of the tax of Charles county; were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Johnson, entitled, An act to regulate the election of clerk of the County Court and Register of Wills, for Frederick county, was taken up for consideration.

When on motion by Mr. Edelen, said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Sothoron, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for marking and bounding land, passed at November session, 1786, as relates to Saint Mary's county, was taken up for consideration; when on motion by Mr. Heard, said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Stewart, from the select committee, delivered the following report.

The Committee appointed to examine the condition of the furniture in the Government house, respectfully report.

That they have inspected the furniture and return herewith an inventory of the articles found therein, to which they have attached an inventory of indispensable articles already purchased by the present Governor, and an account of repairs made during the past year. The committee found several of the Chambers on the second floor, destitute of carpeting, and a great deficiency of many other articles actually necessary for the convenience and comfort of the House. The committee recommend an appropriation of five hundred dollars in addition to the appropriation of last year, for the purpose of purchasing such articles of furniture, as his Excellency the present Governor may deem necessary for the government house.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the Western Shore, be, and he is hereby directed to pay to his Excellency, the Governor of Maryland, or his order, the sum of five hundred dollars, and the amount of the appropriation, made at the last session of the Legislature to the late Governor, to be expended by him in procuring furniture and making repairs at the Government house.*
