Mr. Ely presented the petition of the trustees of Clover Hill School, in Baltimore county, and sundry other citizens within the vicinity of said school, praying a donation for the purpose of carrying more fully into effect the operations of said school; which was read and referred to the committee on education.

Mr. Turner, of Baltimore, presented the petition of Hugh O'Brien, counter to the memorial of his wife Cassandra O'Brien, praying a divorce from her said husband; which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

The clerk of the Senate returned the bill, entitled, an act for the relief of Sarah Funston, of Frederick county, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read the first, and second time by special order, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed; and the resolution requiring the treasurer of the Western Shore to pay and redeem the five per cent. loan, endorsed, "assented to;" ordered to be engrossed;

And, delivered a bill, originated in, and passed by the Senate, entitled, An act for the relief of John A. Stanbery, of the city of Baltimore; which was read, and referred to

the committee on insolvency;

Also, a bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled An act, to incorporate the Baltimore and Pitston Coal company; which was read, and referred to Messrs. Lauren-

son, Hunt and Armstrong;

And, a petition of sundry citizens of Frederick and Washington counties, praying for the distruction of Foxes, in said counties, endorsed, "referred by the Senate to the consideration of the House of Delegates."

Which was read.

And delivered the following message.
