In pursuance whereof, the speaker appointed Messrs. Brookhart and Richardson on said committee

The speaker laid before the house a communication from John R. Magruder, tobacco inspector, relative to the dilapidated condition of the State's tobacco warehouse No. 2; which was read and referred to the committee on tobacco warehouses.

Mr. Roberts obtained leave to bring in a bill, directing the entry of satisfaction of judgments, decrees and recognizances, and of payments of executions; ordered that Messrs. Roberts, Pearce and Edelen, report the same

Mr. Hunt obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate Baer's Chemical Works of Baltimore; ordered that Messrs. Hunt, Laurensen and Turner, of Baltimore, report the same.

Mr. Turner, of Baltimore, obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, An act to authorise the commissioners of Baltimore county, to appoint collectors of taxes in cases therein mentioned; ordered that Messrs. Turner, of Baltimore, Stansbury and Ely, report the same.

On motion by Mr. Rogerson,

Ordered, That the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, be instructed to inquire into the propriety of placing Thomas Pinder and William Cooper of Ohio county, state of Kentucky, on the pension roll of this state.

Mr. Edelen, chairman of the select committee, delivered the following report:

The committee to which was referred the report of the commissioners appointed by the Governor and Council to examine the Tobacco Inspection Houses in the city of Baltimore, and the different scites on the basin, and to report to the Legislature the expediency or in expediency of concentrating the same, begs leave to Report,

That they have given to the subject of the Report referred to them the consideration which its interests and importance in reference to the planting interest of the state seem to demand.

In deciding upon the question of expediency of concentrating the inspection houses, or in other words recommending the adoption of the report of said commissioners; your committee deem it unnecessary to enter at large upon the reasons in favor of such concentration, as they are pretty fully presented to the house in the Report referred to, but will very briefly state one or two considerations
