

THURSDAY, January 26th, 1832.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, An act appointing commissioners to fix on a scite for a bridge over Deer Creek, in Harford county, at or near Deaths Ford or Wilson's Mill, or at some scite between said places, and to authorise a levy not exceeding one thousand dollars for the purpose of erecting the same;

Also, the bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to provide for the collection of the public revenue; passed at December session, eighteen hundred and twenty-nine; chapter ninety;

And, the bill, entitled, An act to open and extend Pleasant street, in the city of Baltimore;

And, the bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate the Baltimore and Pitston Coal Company;

And, the resolution authorising the Governor and Council, to forward, annually, to the Executive of each State and Territory in the Union three copies of the laws annually, passed by the General Assembly of this State, &c.; were sent to the Senate.

Mr. Gantt submitted the following message; which was read, assented to, and sent to the Senate.
