FRIDAY, January 27th, 1832.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for marking and bounding land, passed at November session, seventeen hundred and eighty six, as relates to Saint Mary's county;

Also, the bill entitled, A supplement to an act entitled, An act for the protection of sheep in the several counties of this state;

Also, the bill entitled, An act to provide for the inspection of certain corporations;

Also, the bill entitled, An act to authorise the levy court of Kent county, to levy a sum of money therein mentioned, to be applied to the enlargement and repair of the house in which the offices of clerk of the court, and register of wills of said county are kept and held;
