

Severally endorsed, Will pass, with the proposed amendments; which amendments were severally read the first and second time by special order; severally assented to; and the bills ordered to be engrossed;

And delivered a bill, originated in and passed by the senate entitled, an act to authorise the clerk of Frederick county court, to record a deed from Moses Eury to William Eury; which was read and referred to Messrs. Richardson, Jones, of Frederick, and Johnson;

Mr. Teackle, chairman of the committee on ways and means, reported a bill, entitled, an act further supplemental to the act of December session, eighteen hundred and twenty seven, chapter 111, entitled, an act to regulate sales by public auction;

Which was read.

The unfavorable report of the committee on divorces, upon the petition of Cassandra O'Brien, of the city of Baltimore, praying to be divorced from her husband. Hugh O'Brien, was taken up for consideration; read the first time, and concurred in;

The unfavourable report of the committee on inspections, to which was referred the petition of Henry Webb and others, of the city of Baltimore, praying an alteration in the mode of inspecting shad, was taken up for consideration,

When on motion by Mr Gantt, said report was ordered to lie on the table.

The report submitted by Mr Edelen, on the 25th inst. relating to the tobacco inspection houses in the city Baltimore, was taken up for consideration.

On motion by Mr Hood, the house was called and the door-keeper sent for the absent members.

On motion by Mr. Teackle, the house resolved to proceed with the ordinary business of the session during the absence of the door-keeper.

The house then proceeded by ballot to the election of directors on the part of the state in the several banks wherein the state, as a stockholder, is entitled to directors; in conformity with arrangement made with the Senate for that purpose, and the ballots of the members being collected in the ballot box, it was sealed up, and delivered to the committee appointed on the part of this house to meet the committee named on the part of the Senate, to count the joint ballot of both houses, and report the result, who retired to the conference room.
