

ining and counting the votes taken on the joint ballot, for directors on the part of the State in the several Banks, wherein the State, as a stockholder, is entitled to directors, and of reporting the result, accordingly reported as follows; that from an examination of the ballot boxes, it appeared that there were altogether seventy-eight ballots taken

That, For the Mechanic's Bank of Baltimore, Thomas Mumery had 27 votes, Francis Neale had 55 votes, and Joseph J. Speed 51 votes.

For the Farmers Bank of Maryland, Nicholas Brewer junior, had 55 votes, and George Wells had 56 votes.

For the Branch Bank of the Farmers Bank of Maryland, William Clark had 58 votes, and James Price had 75 votes.

For the Hagerstown Bank, John Van Lear, junior, had 57 votes, and John Walgamot had 74 votes

For the Elkton Bank, Adam Whann had 74 votes.

Whereupon, it was declared in the House of Delegates, that the following named persons were duly elected directors on the part of the state, in the respective Banks above mentioned, for and during the current year, viz.

That, For the Mechanic's Bank of Baltimore, Francis Neale, and Joseph J. Speed.

For the Farmers' Bank of Maryland, Nicholas Brewer, junior, and George Wells.

For the Branch Bank of the Farmers' Bank of Maryland, William Clark, and James Price.

For the Hagerstown Bank, John Van Lear, junior, and John Walgamot.

For the Elkton Bank, Adam Whann.
