A bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act for quietting possessions, enrolling conveyances and securing the estates of purchasers.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all deeds or instruments of writing, which have been taken, executed and acknowledged within this state, since the first day of September last, which may not have been signed, and sealed by any feme covert, as required by the act of December session, 1830, chapter 164, be, and the same are hereby confirmed, and made valid to all intents and purposes, provided that in all other respects, the act, entitled, An act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances and securing the estates of purchasers, and the several supplements thereto, have been complied with.

On the question being put, will the house adopt the substitute; it was resolved in the affirmative.
