thorise and empower the commissioners of Baltimore county, to levy a sum of money and rebuild a bridge over Herring Run on the road leading from Baltimore to Belle Air on what is called the Belle Air road.

The said bill was then read the second time and passed. The door-keeper having returned, reported that in obedience to order, he had notified the absent members that their attendance in the house was required.

The house then resumed the consideration of the order

of the day.

Which was read the second time.

Mr. Teackle, then offered as a substitute for said bill the

following.

A bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act for quietting possessions, enrolling conveyances and securing the estates of purchasers.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all deeds or instruments of writing, which have been taken, executed and acknowledged within this state, since the first day of September last, which may not have been singned, and sealed by any feme covert, as required by the act of December session, 1830, chapter 164, be, and the same are hereby confirmed, and made valid to all intents and purposes, provided that in all other respects, the act, entitled, An act for quieting possessions; enrolling conveyances and securing the estates of purchasers, and the several supplements thereto, have been complied with.

On the question being put, will the house adopt the sub-

stitute; it was resolved in the affirmative.
