On motion of Mr. Turner, of Baltimore county, the house took up for consideration the bill reported by Mr. Lyles, chairman of the committee on inspections, entitled, An act providing for the inspection of sole leather, rough harness, and rough skirting leather, in the city of Baltimore.

On motion by Mr. Hunt, the first section of said bill was amended, by striking out in the fourth line thereof the words "two or."

Mr. Brookhart moved further to amend said section, by inserting after the word "leather," in the seventh line there of, these words "or any other rough leather;"

Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Edelen, the fourth section of the bill was amended, by striking out in the first line thereof, after the word "inspector," the word "may," and inserting in lieu thereof the word "shall."

On motion by Mr. Edelen, said section was further amended, by striking out from the word "damp," in the se-

cond line thereof, to the end of said section.

On motion by Mr. Brookhart, said bill was then recommitted to the committee, with instructions to report a bill to

provide for the inspection of leather generally.

Mr. Hollman, from the committee, made a favorable report upon the bill from the Senate, entitled, An act for the benefit of the heirs and creditors of George Tilghman, late of Washington county, deceased, and for other purposes:

The said bill was then read the first and second time by

special order, passed, and returned to the Senate.

Mr. Jones, of Frederick, from the committee, made a favorable report upon the bill from the Senate, entitled, an act to authorise the clerk of Frederick county court, to record a deed from Moses Eury to William Eury.

The said bill was then read the first and second time by

special order, passed and returned to the Senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Mitchell, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the benefit of the children of Robert J Henry, late of Worcester county, deceased, was taken ua for consideration, read the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Willson, of Cecil, reported a bill, entitled, An act to authorise commissioners of Cecil county, to build a bridge overthe big North East Creek, at or near William Phillips' in said county;

Which was read the first and second time by special or-

der, passed and sent to the Senate.
