The clerk of the Senate returned the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Frederick and Woodsborough Turn-

pike Road company;

Also, the bill, entitled, An act appointing commissioners to fix on a site for a bridge over Deer Creek, in Harford county, at or near Death's Ford; or Willson's mill, at or near some site between said places, and to authorise a levy not exceeding one thousand dollars, for the purpose of erecting the same; severally endorsed, 'Will pass;'-ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the resolution in favour of Gideon Pearce, and for other purposes; endorsed, assented to; ordered to be en-

grossed;

And, the resolution in favour of John Evans, of Baltimore county; endorsed, assented to, with the proposed amendments;

Which amendments were severally read the first and second time by special order, severally assented to, and or-

dered to be engrossed.

Mr. Gantt submitted the following message; which was read, assented to, and sent to the Senate:

By the House of Delegates, January 30th, 1832.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We propose, with the concurrence of your honorable body, to proceed to-morrow at 12 o'clock, to the election of a bank director on the part of the State, in the Farmers' and Merchants' bank of Baltimore. Thomas Mummy is nominated by this house; and we have appointed Messrs. Gantt and Teackle to join such gentlemen as may be named by your honorable body, to count the ballots and report the result.
