Mr. Johnson reported a bill entitled, An act for the benetit of Joseph Fogle, of the state of Kentucky, a lunatic.

Mr. Brawner, chairman of the committee on grievances and courts of justice, reported a bill entitled, An act for the relief of the widow, heirs and devisees of Stephen Raphel the elder.

And Mr. Handy, chairman of the committee on expiring laws, reported a bill entitled, An act to continue in force the acts of assembly which would expire with the present session;

Which were severally read.

The bill reported by Mr. Hall entitled, An act to incorporate a company in Funkstown, in Washington county, under the name of the Funkstown juvenile librarian society; was taken up for consideration, read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Swan, entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, An act to provide for electing commissioners for Allegany county, and prescribing their powers and duties, passed December session, 1829, chapter 25; was taken up for consideration;

When on motion by Mr. Lantz, said bill was amended, by striking out, in the first section and third line thereof, from the word "directed," to the end of said section, and inserting in lieu thereof, the following, "to cause to be made and use, a corporate seal, and may alter the same at their pleasure, as may be necessary to give validity to the acts of the said commissioners;"

The said bill was then read the second time as amended, passed and sent to the senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Johnson, entitled, An act for the division of Baltimore and Frederick counties, and for erecting a new one by the name of Westminster, was taken up for consideration.

When on motion by Mr. Ely, said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Brookhart, entitled, An act to abolish all and every such part of the constitution and form of government of this State as relates to the appointment and tenure of office of Register of Wills and clerks of the county courts of this state, was taken up for consideration.

When on motion by Mr. Brookhart, said bill was laid on the table, and made the order of the day for Tuesday next, the 7th of February.
