Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That his Excellency, the Governor, be, and he is hereby requested, forthwith, to take the necessary legal measures, by injunction, or otherwise, to prevent the reconstruction or repair of the Muncy and Shamokin Dams, in the Susquehanna River, State of Pennsylvania-which obstructions to the free navigation of said River have been recently carried away.

Mr. Armstrong, from the select committee, made a favorable report on the petition of Robinson Savage, of Allegany county; accompanied with the following preamble and re-

solution: Whereas, it is represented to this general assembly of Maryland, by the petition of Robinson Savage of Allegany county, that he had surveyed and laid out for him, under a special warrant, 523 acres of land, lying in Allegany county; and fully compounded, and obtained a patent for the same; And whereus, it is further represented, that said land was heretofore granted by the state, to a certain Edward Berry, e soldier of the revolution; who, it is stated, died intestate, and without heirs, and that said land became escheatable to the state; and could therefore only be affected by an escheat warrant; but as said Savage has paid to the treasurer, the composition therefor, it would be unjust in the state again to exact it;—therefore,

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the patent heretofore granted out of the western shore land office, to Robinson Savage, of Allegany county, bearing date the 20th day of February, 1828, on a certificate of survey, called "Crickets Legs," containing 523 acres, be, and the same shall be as valid, to all intents and purposes, as if said
