On motion by Mr. Laurensen, the house took up for consideration the resolution submitted by him on the 1st inst. relative to preventing the re-construction or repair of the Muncy and Shamokin dams, in the Susquehanna river.

On motion by Mr. Brawner, said resolution was amended by striking out these words, "the necessary legal measures by injunction or otherwise;" and inserting in lieu thereof the following; "such measures as he by and with the advice and consent of the council may deem expedient."

The said resolution was then read the second time, as amended and assented to.

The bill reported by Mr. Ely, entitled, An act to incorporate the Baltimore and Chesapeake Steam Saw Mill Company, was taken up for consideration.

Mr. Teackle moved to amend said bill by striking out in the first section, sixteenth line, these words, "other timber or logs," and inserting in lieu thereof the following; "scantling sawed by the operation of the said company."

Mr. Thomas, of Queen Anne's, offered as a substitute for said amendment the following, in these words, "which the said company may saw."

On the question being put, will the house adopt the substitute, it was determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put on the adoption after the amendment as proposed by Mr. Teackle—resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Handy moved further to amend said section by striking out in the seventeenth line thereof, the words "estate and,"—determined in the negative.

Mr. Bell then moved to amend said section by inserting of the word "property," in the same line, these words, "real estate excepted"—resolved in the affirmative.
