

was amended, by striking out, in the second line thereof, after the word "into" the word "two," and inserting in lieu thereof the word "one."

Mr. Ely moved further to amend said section by striking out in the same line, after the word "of," the word "one," and insert "two."

Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Teackle, the fourth section of the bill was amended, by inserting after the word "granted," in the 11th line, these words; "Provided, that the successors shall be elected within thirty days of the time on which the election should have been made."

On motion by Mr. Teackle, the sixth section of said bill was amended, by striking out in the second line the words "expiration of twenty-five years from its passage;" and inserting in lieu thereof the following in these words, "year eighteen hundred and forty-five."

The said bill was then read the second time as amended, and passed.

On motion by Mr. Teackle, the house took up for consideration the bill reported by him, as chairman of the committee on ways and means, entitled, An act further supplemental to the act of December session, 1827, chapter 111, entitled, An act to regulate sales by public auction.

On motion by Mr. Ely, the house was called and the door keeper sent for the absent members.

On motion by Brawner, the house resolved to proceed with the ordinary business of the session, during the absence of the door keeper.

The bill reported by Mr. Hunt, entitled, An act to incorporate Baer's Chymical works of Baltimore, was taken up for consideration.

When on motion by Mr. Pearce, said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Wilson, of Montgomery, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to allow Adam Robb, Executor of Upton Beall, late clerk of Montgomery county court, further time to complete certain records, passed at December session, 1828, chapter 2.

The bill reported by Mr. Handy, chairman of the committee on expiring laws, entitled, An act to continue in force the acts of Assembly, which would expire with the present session;

And, the bill reported by Mr. Johnson, entitled, An act for the benefit of Joseph Fogle, of the State of Kentucky, a Lunatick.
