

Which was twice read and concurred in.

Mr. Willson, of Montgomery, reported a bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to provide for the repairs of public roads in Montgomery county, passed at December session 1826, chapter 227.

Mr. Laurenson reported a bill, entitled, An act to exempt a part of Holland street, in the city of Baltimore, from the operation of the 16th section of the act of eighteen hundred and seventeen, chapter one hundred and forty-eight, entitled, An act relating to the city of Baltimore.

Mr. Turner, of Baltimore, reported a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of the securities of the collectors of taxes and of sheriffs.

Mr. Belt reported a bill, entitled, An act for the re assessment of the real and personal property in Prince George's county;

Which were severally read.

Mr. Stewart reported a bill, entitled, An act supplementary to an act, entitled, An act for the relief of John Childs, of Anne Arundel county, passed at December session, 1830, chapter 172;

Which was read the first and second time by special order, and passed.

The speaker announced the following message as having been received from the senate on yesterday; the bill, entitled, An act to provide for the payment of jurors in Baltimore county, without the limits of the city; endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments," which amendments were severally read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table;

Also the resolution in favor of the heirs of Benjamin Howard, a revolutionary soldier; endorsed "dissented from," and delivered the following message:

By the Senate,

February 2d, 1832.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have rejected the resolution in favor of the legal representatives or administrators of Benjamin Howard, a soldier of the revolutionary war, granting a common warrant for fifty acres of vacant land lying in Allegany county, or order, for issuing a patent for the said quantity of acres of land upon a certificate of the surveyor thereof, duly returned, without requiring payment or the proof of payment, or any composition money therefor.

Because, the said resolution extends to the administrators,
