On motion by Mr. Johnson, the house took up for consideration the bill from the Senate, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act to authorise the Governor and Council of Maryland, to appoint the inspectors of flour for this state, passed at December session, 1825, chapter 174.

Mr. Brookhart moved to amend said bill by striking out in the first section, fourth line, after the word "cent," the words, "and a half."
