Mr McKinstrey presented the petition of sundry citizens of Emmitsburg, in Frederick county, praying for a supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate said town; which was read, and referred to Messrs. McKinstrey, Richardson, and Jones, of Frederick;

Also, presented the petition of sundry citizens of Frederick county, praying for an act to incorporate the trustees of the Valley School, in said county, and for other purposes; which was read, and referred to Messrs. McKinstrey,

Johnson, and Richardson.

Mr. Richardson presented the petition of sundry citizens of Middletown, in Frederick county, praying for an amendment of the law passed at December session, 1822, chapter 179, entitled, An act to incorporate the trustees of the public school in Middletown, in Frederick county, so as to make them elective by the people interested in said school; which was read, and referred to Messrs. Richardson, Johnson, and Jones, of Frederick;

Also presented the petition of Sarah White, of Montgomery county, praying for a pension, for revolutionary services rendered by her deceased husband, Samuel U. White; which was read, and referred to the committee on

pensions and revolutionary claims;

And, presented the petition of sundry citizens of Fredericktown, in Frederick county, counter to the petition of sundry other citizens of said Town, praying for a law to authorise the corporate authorities of said town to levy a tax for certain purposes, &c.; which was read, and referred to the committee appointed on the petition to which it scounter.

Mr. White presented the memorial of sundry citizens of Montgomery county, praying a further grant of power to the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company;

Also, presented the memorial of sundry citizens of Montgomery county, counter to the memorial of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company.

Which were severally read, and referred to the commit-

tee on Internal Improvement.

Mr. Laurenson presented the memorial of Luther J. Cox, and Moir, and others of the city of Baltimore, praying for an act to prevent the inspection of fish, on Pratt street, in the city of Baltimore; which was read, snd referred to the committee on inspections.

Mr. Nicols presented the memorial of Samuel Pattison, security and administrator of Nathaniel Applegarth, late Sheriff of Dorchester county, praying for further time to
