Sec. 8. And be it enacted, That this act shall continue in force until the year 1845, and until the end of the next general assembly that shall happen thereafter and no longer.

The said bill was then read the second time as amended

and passed.

On motion by Mr. Stansbury, the house took up for consideration the amendments proposed by the senate, to the bill entitled, An act to provide for the payment of jurors in Baltimore county, without the limits of the city.

Which amendments were severally read the first and second time by special order, assented to, and the bill or-

dered to be engrossed.

The bill reported by Mr. Johnson, chairman of the committee on internal improvements, entitled. An act to incorporate the Baltimore and Annapolis rail road company, was taken up for consideration, read the second time and passed.
