

The bill reported by Mr. Brawner, entitled, An act for the benefit of Charlotte Hall School, was taken up for consideration, and read the second time.

Mr. Teackle moved to reconsider the first section of the bill.

Determined in the negative.

The question was then put, shall the said bill pass.

Determined in the negative.

The bill, reported by Hunt, entitled, An act to incorporate the Maryland Beneficial Society of Baltimore, was taken up for consideration.

On motion by Mr. Teackle, the fifth section of said bill was amended by striking out in the second line the word "sixty" and inserting in lieu thereof, the word "forty-five."

The said bill was then read the second time, as amended and passed.

The clerk of the Senate returned the bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to provide for the collection of the public revenue, passed at December session, 1829, chapter 90;

Also, the bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the benefit of the children of Robert J. Henry, late of Worcester county deceased, severally endorsed, "will pass;" ordered to be engrossed;

Also, resolutions in favour of Charles E. Tilden, and Jacob C. Wilson, severally endorsed, "assented to;" ordered to be engrossed.

And delivered the following message.
