Which were severally read and referred to the committee on claims.

Mr. Teackle obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, A supplement to an act, to incorporate the Baltimore Life Insurance Company; ordered that Messrs. Teackle, Laurenson, Brawner, Handy and Pearce, report the same.

Mr. Hollman obtained leave to pring in a bill, to be entitled, An act in relation to justices of he orphan's courts of this state; ordered that Messrs Hollman, Harding and

Parran, report the same.

Mr. Turner, of Baltimore, obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, A further additional supplementary act, to the act, entitled, An act to establish orphan's courts in the several counties of this state, passed at February session 1777; ordered that Messrs. Turner, of Baltimore, Harding and Pearce, report the same.

On motion by Mr Brown, of Queen Anne's,

Ordered, That the report of the commissioners appointed by resolution No 72 of December session 1829, made to the last general assembly, containing surveys and estimates, and the costs of removing certain obstructions to the navigation of the Chester river, be withdrawn from the files of this house and referred to the standing committee on internal improvements.

Mr. Rogerson, chairman of the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, made an unfavorable report on the petition of Samuel Morton, of St. Mary's county;

Which was twice read and concurred in.

Mr. Rogerson, chairman of the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, to which was referred an order of the house, to inquire into the expediency of allowing a pension to Thomas Haywood, of St. Mary's county, a soldier of the revolutionary war; reported favorably thereon, accompanied with the following resolution

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the Western Shore, say to Thomas Haywood, of St. Mary's county, a soldier of the revolutionary was, or to his order during life, in half yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, in consideration for his services during the said war.
