

Also the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of lower west Nottingham Presbyterian Church;

Also the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of the heirs and representatives of the late Nicholas Snowden; severally endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments," which amendments were severally read the first and second time by special order; severally assented to and the bills ordered to be engrossed;

Also the resolution relative to the laws of the different states and territories;

Also the resolution authorising the treasurer to pay to his excellency the governor, fifty dollars, being the amount paid by him for a horse pressed in the service of the state, and died while in such service; severally endorsed "assented to," ordered to be engrossed;

Also the resolution relating to the free school fund; endorsed "dissented from;"

And delivered the following message:—

By the Senate, February 7th, 1832.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

We return you the resolution relating to the school fund rejected, as the Senate is not competent to amend it. The resolution proposes to distribute the general free schools fund, and the senate presumes it was the intention of your house, to direct the distribution of common free schools fund, there being no fund, known as the general free schools fund. We therefore return the resolution to your house for amendment.
