Amos, Moores, and Johns

Mr. Johns presented the petition of the trustees of the Alms house of Harford county, praying for the passage of a law, authorising the commissioners of said county, to levy a sum of money for purposes therein mentioned, which was read, and referred to Messrs. Johns, Moores, and Amos.

Mr. Hunt presented the petition of William W. Handy and others, of the city of Baltimore, praying the passage of an act, to provide for the extension of Bottle Alley; which was read and referred to Messrs. Hunt, Laurensen and Holmes;
