*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all those officers and soldiers, or their representatives, to whom land warrants have been issued for revolutionary services, and who have not already located the same, be and they are hereby authorised to locate their several warrants on any vacant land lying in Allegany county, any thing in their said warrants, or in any law of this state, to the contrary notwithstanding.*
