Which was read.

The bill reported by Mr. Hunt, entitled, An additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of Lumber in the city of Baltimore, was taken up for consideration.

Mr Powell moved to amend said bill, by striking out in the first section, and sixth line, the words "one hundred," and insert in lieu thereof the words "twenty-five."

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Orrell moved to strike out the words, "one hundred dollars," and insert "fifty cents."

Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Heard, said bill was amended by adding at the end thereof as an additional section, the following.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That hereafter it shall be the duty of the said inspectors when they are called upon to inspect any plank or other Lumber, which shall have been measured and marked, and said measurement shall appear to be incorrect, to cause the same to be obliterated.

Mr. Bell moved further to amend said bill, by adding at the end thereof the following as an additional section.

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted*, That from and after the first day of April next, it shall not be lawful for any inspector of lumber, in the city of Baltimore, to charge or receive more than twenty cents per thousand feet for measuring, inspecting, and marking any pine or oak lumber or timber, which shall be of a greater thickness than two inches, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

On the question being put, will the house adopt said amendment, as an additional section, it was resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Teackle, the yeas and nays were ordered, and appeared as follows.
