7th. An oration to be delivered by the honorable Littleton Purnell Dennis, of the senate.

8th. A prayer by the Rev. Chaplain of the house of

delegates.

9th. A federal salute to be fired at sunset.

The reading of the Valedictory and delivery of the oration, to be in the hall of the senate, that being the chamber in which the illustrious Father of the republic resigned his military commission. On this occasion the portrait of Washington and his two aids, will be taken from the hall of the delegates to that of the senate, and placed behind the orator.
