Which were severally read, and referred to the commit-

tee on Internal improvement.

Mr. Stockett presented the memorial of sundry citizens of Anne Arundel county, relating to ordinary keepers, &c.; which was read, and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Turner, of Baltimore, obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, An act to confirm the proceedings of the commissioners of Baltimore county; ordered, that Messrs. Turner, of Baltimore, Ely, and Holmes, report the same.

Mr. Hollman obtained leave to bring in a bill, to regulate the transportation of baggage and other small parcels on the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road; ordered, that Messrs. Hollman, Hunt, and Richardson, report the same.

On motion by Mr. Brookhart,

Ordered, That the committee on inspections enquire into the expediency and propriety of passing a law for the inspection of green hides, in the city of Baltimore, and that they report by bill or otherwise.

On motion by Mr. M'Kinstrey,

Ordered, That the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, inquire into the expediency of allowing a pension to Elizabeth Donnelly, widow of Patrick Donnelly, late of Frederick county, deceased, a soldier of the revolutionary war.

On motion by Mr. Brawner,

Ordered, That the chairman of the committee appointed on the part of the House to consider the memorial of several of the incorporated banks in the city of Baltimore be anthorised to require of the treasurer, clerk of the Council, or other officer who may have charge of the same, any paper, record or memoranda connected with said subject or a copy thereof, as occasion may require.

Mr. M'Kinstrey reported a bill, entitled, An act to repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the division of Frederick county, into twelve elec-

tion districts, and for other purposes.

Mr. Teackle reported a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the admission of Worcester county, to the benefits of an act, entitled, An act to provide for the public instruction of youth in primary schools throughout this state.

Mr. Jones, of Frederick, reported a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to provide for the purchase of the office papers belonging to the Surveyor's office of Frederick county, and to repeal an act therein mentioned.
