Mr. White presented the petition of Thomas Dawson, of Nicholas, of Montgomery county, praying the passage of an act to authorise the levy court of said county, to levy the sum of money therein mentioned; which was read and referred to Messrs. White, Harding and Gittings.

Mr. M'Kinstrey presented the petition of sundry citizens of Frederick and Baltimore counties, praying for the passage of an act, to authorise the laying out and opening a road therein mentioned, and for other purposes; which was read and referred to Messrs. McKinstrey, Jones, of Frederick, Turner, of Baltimore, Ely and Hood.

Mr. Heard presented the memorial of the Pilots of the Chesapeake Bay, counter to the memorial of sundry persons concerned in and connected with the coasting trade; which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Belt presented the petition of the levy court of Prince George's county, praying for a re-valuation of the real and personal property in said county; which was read and referred to Messrs. Belt, Lyles and Wootton.

Mr. Lantz presented the petition of Jacob Garlock of Allegany county, praying for a divorce; which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

And Mr. Brewer presented the petition of Margaret Lamb, of the city of Annapolis, the widow of a revolutionary soldier, praying for a pension; which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Nicols presented the report of the trustees of the New Market Academy, in Dorchester county; which was read and referred to the committee on education.

Mr. Johnson obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, An act for the relief of George Baltzell, collector of taxes for Frederick county; ordered that Messrs. Johnson, Jones, of Frederick and Richardson, report the same.
