Also, the bill entitled, An act for the relief of Margaret Saylor, of Allegany county;

Also, the bill entitled, An act to provide for the building of a bridge over the Great Falls of Gunpowder, at or near

to Jessop's Mill, in Baltimore county;

Also, the bill entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled, An act to authorise the laying out and opening a road through Frederick, Anne Arundel and Montgomery counties;

Also, the bill entitled, An act to enable John Cummins, of the state of Delaware, to remove a negro out of this

state, in whom he possesses an unexpired term;

Also, the bill entitled, An act to divorce Henrietta T. Stewart, of the city of Baltimore, from her husband, James Stewart;

Also, the preamble and resolution relative to warrants for bounty land, heretofore granted by the state to sundry offi-

cers and soldiers of the revolutionary war;

Also, the resolution requiring the armourer to deliver to Captain Charles R. Stewart, a certain number of rifles, &c.;

Also, the resolution relative to equalizing the donations granted to the academies and schools in the several coun-

ties of this state;

And the resolution relating to postage paid or chargeable to the members of the legislature;—were sent to the senate.

Mr. Brewer presented the petition of William Caton, of the city of Annapolis, praying to be refunded money paid into the treasury; which was read and referred to the committee on claims;

Mr. Thomas, of Cecil, presented five memorials from the citizens of Cecil county, counter to the memorial for a repeal of the acts of assembly relating to the county commissioners; which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Wootton presented the petitions of John Burnell, Mary Ann P. Collins and Miah Kidwell, and wife, of Prince George's county, severally praying to be placed on the pension list of said county;

Which were read and severally referred to the committee on pensions to indigent persons by county assessment.

Mr. Moores presented the petition of Stephen Watters, of Harford county, praying for the passage of an act authorising the clerk of said county to record a deed there-
