sion, eighteen hundred and thirty, "directing a survey and estimate of the cost of removing the impediments in Chester river, from Sutton's point, to the town of Millington," and beg leave to report in favour thereof. The sum of twelve hundred and forty-five dollars seems from the report of the said commissioners to be the estimate of cost, to which the committee think an addition of the sum of two hundred and sixty-five dollars would cover all the additional expenses of agents, to superintend the execution of this work.

Your committee therefore recommend, that the sum of fifteen hundred dollars be appropriated for the execution of this desirable object, the same to be placed under the direction of the Governor and Council, and herewith submit

a resolution to effect this object.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay, or cause to be paid, to the order of the Governor, from time to time, in such sums of money as may be drawn for, the sum of fifteen hundred dollars, the same to be applied to the removal of the impediments in Chester river, from Sutton's point to the town of Millington, under the direction of the commissioner's heretofore appointed by a resolution, number seventytwo, of December session, eighteen hundred and twentynine; and the said commissioners shall not draw for any part or; parcel of the sum hereby appropriated until they, or a majority of them shall certify to the Governor, that they have contracted for the removal of the impediments aforesaid, and have taken bond with security by them approved, in a penalty of double the amount hereby appropriated, to secure the performance of the same, and that the commissioners aforesaid shall report to the next General Assembly of Maryland, an estimate of the whole expenditure thereof.

Which was read.

On motion by Mr. Turner, of Baltimore,

Ordered, That the petition of Samuel T. Anderson and others, of Baltimore county, in relation to a certain road therein mentioned, be withdrawn from the files of the house.
