## FRIDAY, February 17th, 1832.

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday, with the addition of Mr. Speaker Thomas, who appeared in the house, and resumed the chair. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, An act to authorise the clerk of Har-

ford county court, to record a deed therein mentioned;

Also, the bill entitled, An additional supplement to the act entitled, An act for the promotion of internal improvement;

Also, the bill entitled, An act to incorporate a company to be styled the Allegany coal mine rail road company;

Also, the bill entitled, An act for the relief of Allen

Thomas, of Anne Arundel county;

Also, the resolution authorising the executive to deliver to Henry Korns and Moses II. Lauthar, of the town of Cumberland in Allegany county, or to their order, one piece of six pound iron ordnance, with carriage, &c.;

And, the message adopted by this house on yesterday, relative to inviting his excellency the governor, to attend in the senate chamber, this evening at 4 o'clock, for the purpose of signing and sealing the laws;

Were sent to the senate.

Mr. Laurenson presented the memorial of Rebecca Wood, of the city of Baltimore, praying for a divorce; which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

Mr. Ely presented the petition of Lewis Hunt, of Baltimore county, praying for the passage of an act to change his name to Lewis Cockey Hunt;

Which was read and referred to the committee already

appointed on that subject.

Mr. Carmichael presented the petition of sundry citizens of Queen Anne's county, praying the passage of an act to incorporate a company under the name of the Queen's town creek company;

Which was read and referred to the committee on in-

ternal improvement.

Mr. Sutton presented the petition of sundry citizens of Harford county, praying that William Hughes, and Eleanor his wife, may be placed on the pension list of said county; which was read and referred to the committee on pensions to indigent persons by county assessment;

And, Mr. Hollman presented the petition of Elizabeth Pope, and William C. Drury, or Washington county, praying the passage of an act for the sale of the real estate

therein mentioned;
