Ordered, That Messrs. Jones, of Caroline, Charles and Hardcastle, report the same.

On motion by Mr. Thomas, of Queen Anne's,

Ordered, That the committee on inspections inquire into the expediency of reducing the standard of the weight of wheat in this state, and have leave to report to this house by bill or otherwise.

On motion by Mr Johnson,

Ordered, That the committee on ways and means be instructed to report to this house, the opinion of that committee, upon the sufficiency of the existing revenue, to sustain the several propositions, involving charges upon the treasury, now pending in the legislature—and, if deemed to be sufficient, to state the adequacy of the measures of finance proposed, and of others, in the contemplation of the committee, to support the different objects of melioration in question, and of further applying the resources of the state, in such works of intercommunication, as may be deemed to comport with sound policy, in reference to the due improvement of the general welfare.

Mr. Teackle submitted the following message, which was read, assented to and sent to the senate.
